The study revealed the following findings:

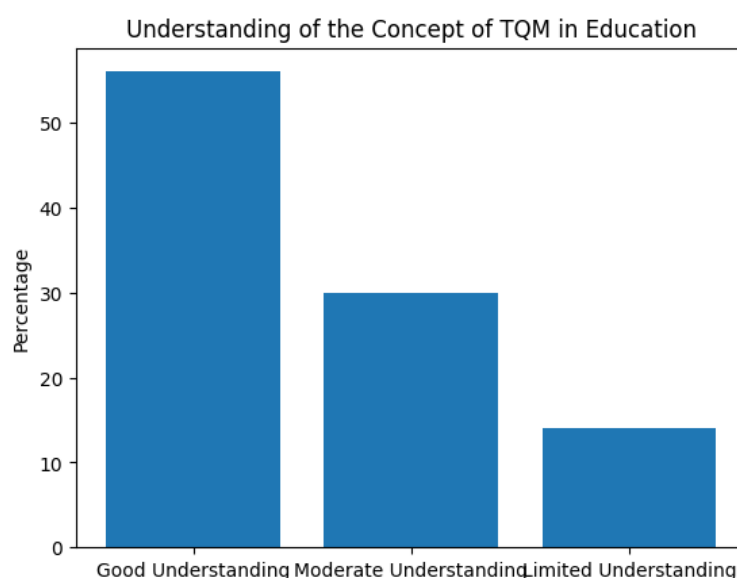
- TQM plays a significant role in improving educational quality.

Total	50	100%

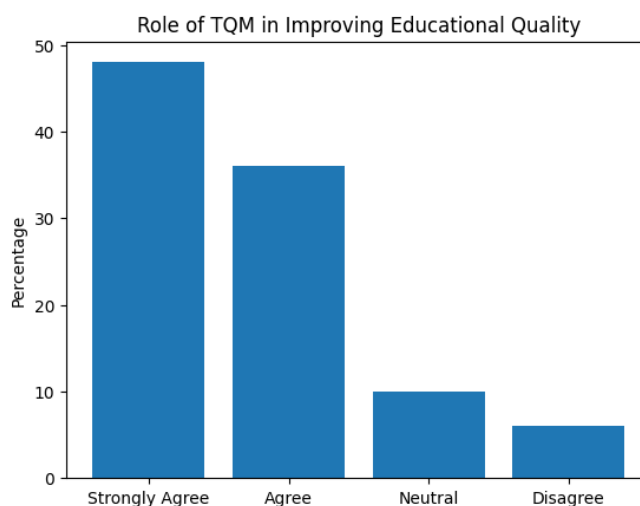

Disagree	3	6%

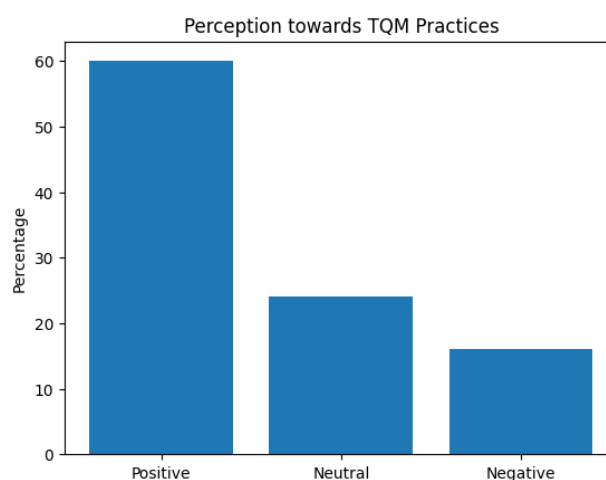
Interpretation: The results reveal that 84% of respondents agree that TQM plays an important role in improving educational quality, suggesting strong support for quality management practices in educational institutions.

Total	50	100%

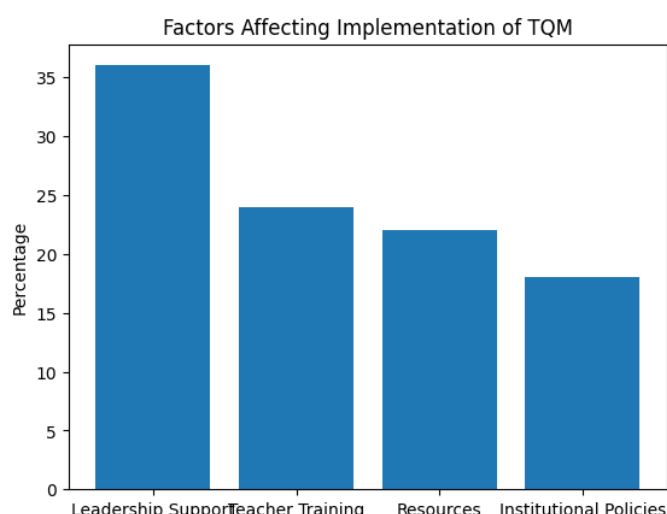

Total	50	100%

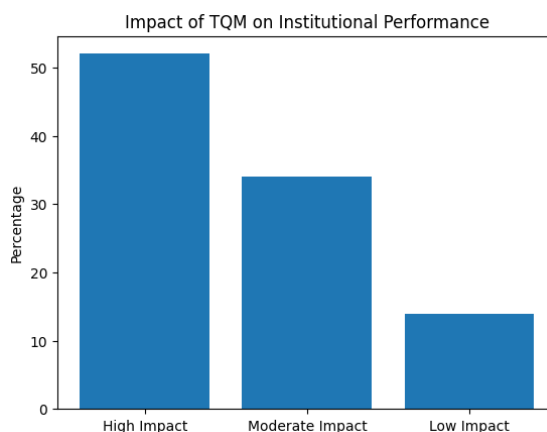
Interpretation: The analysis shows that leadership support is the most influential factor (36%) affecting the implementation of TQM, followed by teacher training and availability of resources
